

New Library Catalog Coming Tuesday, April 14, 2015

The Chicago Ridge Public Library, in connection with 77 SWAN libraries, will be switching over to a new and improved catalog. Our catalog at catalog.swanlibraries.net will look different Tuesday, April 14, but the changes will make using the library even better! One of the most exciting new features will be the ability for you to checkout and download eBooks straight from the online catalog. Our new catalog will be much smarter and will be able to know what you are searching for if you spell a word or author's name incorrectly as well as recommend titles. Developments over the next few months will include the ability to download our library's digital magazines and much of our database content from the catalog and the BookMyne app. We are looking forward to the switch over and to showing you all the new features. Please note that the current SWAN catalog will be unavailable April 11-13 during software installation.

• Will I still access my account in the same way?

You will continue to log in with your library card number to have easy online access to your library account to view your checkouts, holds, and other account information. **In the new catalog your PIN will be reset to the last four digits of your primary phone number.** If you wish to change your PIN, you may reset it once the new catalog is live. You will also be able to choose to receive your notifications by phone, e-mail, or text message.

• Will I still be able to place holds?

You will still be able to place holds on our materials as well as request materials from other libraries. You will now also be able to freeze your holds to receive items after a specific date.

• Can I pay fines online?

Yes, you can log into your account and pay fines online.

• Will my Wish Lists and Reading History transfer?

Your Wish Lists in the current catalog will NOT transfer. Please export this information. Contact Adult Services for help. If you have opted in to save your Reading History, this will transfer to the new catalog.

Friday, May 15 • 11am-12pm






How to Use the New Library Catalog

Monday, May 11 • 7-8pm


